

Every week we have a couple of car-free days - we make the shorter trips by bicycle or go on foot, and for the longer trips we use public transport.

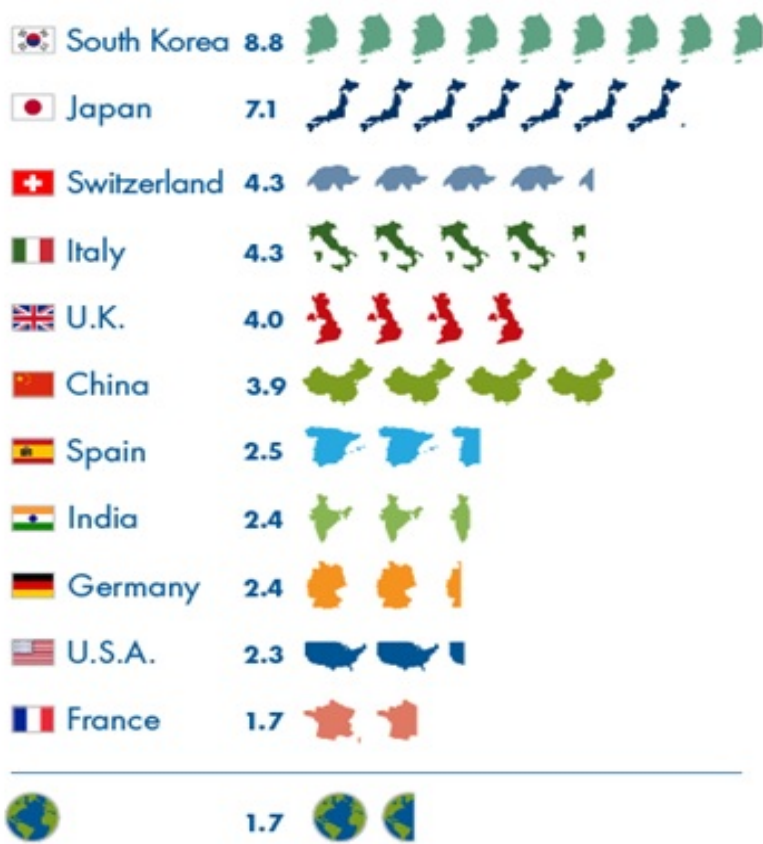

That is, **five months before the end of the year!** Unsurprisingly, since the [1970s](#), [when humanity first began over-consuming](#), this date is the earliest of all the calculations so far.

It is also interesting to see when the Overshoot Day would be if **everyone in the world lived on the average Hungarian footprint**
